

Product: Super Glue Accelerator

Tips

- Using a mini loop applicator keeps the accelerator where you want it and not where you don't
- Keep a fan close by your desk as this stuff has a cancer warning on the label
- Can make joins brittle. If this happens simply peel away and try again
- Make a homeade base out of sculpey or some other sculpting compound to avoid spillage
- It may melt some plastics and paper, test an area first

Application

- There are several ways you can apply this product, here is how I've found works best.
- Apply a dab of super glue to one part
- Apply a touch of accelerator to the other part
- Join the parts together and they fuse literally within two seconds
- Some prefer to spray the accelerator onto a section that has recently been glued, but that's messy
- Comes in pump spray, aerosal, and pure liquid form

My Comments

It took me a while to get used to this stuff and figure out how to make the glued areas non-brittle. The trick is to use as little accelerator as possible. I only use this stuff on days when the glue simply will not take hold (humidity main culprit). I don't like the pump or aerosal, but I prefer to use the mini loop applicator as that helps me limit the amount of accelerator going onto the part..
