

Product: *Brass & Static Leaves*

Tips

- The scale of brass leaves to get vary and are adaptable from 1:60 and 1:100
- Sometimes static leaves are called leaf litter, birch tree leaves, birch tree pod seeds
- Embed the “roots” of your brass trees in Apoxie Sculpt and allow to dry for a true to life look
- You can obtain real birch tree seed pods and separate them, bake, and paint for your own mix
- Drop and pop your static leaves into place with a dot of super glue and tweezers

Application

- Obtain a blank base
- Glue cork or twigs to the base
- Mix in a twisted brass leaf clipping from the sheet of leaves and seat in apoxie or glue
- You can also wrap vines around twigs for an ivy look
- Prime the entire base in black. Paint with greens and browns and dry brush to finish
- Seal the base in a brush-on or spray matte sealer of choice.
- Apply static leaves last.

I ordered 8 sets to experiment with myself. The ivy is a really good thing to embed into dried and painted Plaster of Paris and cork. I didn't place in the competition, but I was told by Mike McVey that my ground work was near perfect. Antenociti is a longtime CMoN member and his products are superb too.
