

Product: Apoxie Sculpt & A+B Epoxy



Tips

- If you apply Sinbad “gloves” to your hand before mixing, it will not stick to your skin as much
- Stay away from the colored Apoxie Sculpt as it tends to get messy
- Aves makes more putties such as Apoxie Clay that doesn’t have a sticky content
- Immediately upon opening, place A+B putty inside separate ziplock bags to preserve freshness
- Water will almost dissolve both of these compounds, use it to smooth out gap filled areas

Application

- These compounds come in two parts that have to be mixed to become activated
- Once mixed (typically 50/50 mixture) wait about 10 minutes for the material to become manageable
- You can apply this over wire for sculpting needs or use it on bases to hold bits and pieces
- The work time varies in climates, but it’s typically about 45 minutes before I notice a difference
- You can file, prime, and paint the hardened mixture afterwards

My Comments

I put these two compounds in the same category because they resemble each other in characteristics. I’ve found that these putties dissolve in water rapidly and have a very creamy texture. Both dry very hard and have a lightweight feel to them. When broken in half, you get a clean smooth break. You also get more material for your money. I primarily use these compounds to build custom bases. Stick cork to it, insert brass leaves into, place rocks on it. Once dried, it holds just as glue would. Use the excess underneath your base to add weight. I’ve also used Aves Fix-It along with duck tape to fix plumbing in my kitchen. One year and holding :)
