

Product: *Milliput (standard) & Crayola Air Dry Clay*



Tips

- Purchase a 12” acrylic roller, or a rolling pin with a good smooth surface, it helps get this stuff flat
- Allow the air-dry clay to dry for a few more days than recommended for a durable component
- Immediately upon opening, place the two parts inside separate ziplock bags to preserve freshness
- If material gets on your tools, make sure you clean promptly
- A good sign that your Milliput is too old to use is when it has very crusty edges or is grainy

Application

- Milliput has to be thoroughly mixed at a ratio of 50/50 to become activated. The clay does not.
- Once mixed it is immediately ready to use
- Place approximately a raquetball size lump of compound on a powdered-down smooth surface
- Take a rolling pin or another flat surface (such as a book) and press the ball flat to roughly 1/8” height
- It should look like a flattened pancake now with broken edges
- Allow to dry completely before removing
- Break apart as necessary and use in your bases as cliff edges and jagged rocks

My Comments

I placed these two components in the same category because I use them for the same purpose. I use both to create jagged rocks on bases. The air-dry clay is cheaper and easier to manipulate and is my preferred method. These two compounds break apart and leave the same “layered” effect in the break, which makes is nice to dry brush against. I usually allow them to dry for about 3 days before I break them apart in small bits. I typically use the model blisters height and packaging to place the material in and wait for it to dry. Something else that helps is to take it outside and throw it up in the air real far while spinning it like a throwing disc and allowing it to fall and hit the pavement. This makes nice grooves along the top of the broken pieces for realistic ground effects.
