

Product: *Super Glue*

## Tips

- Accelerator helps speed up the drying process, but can sometimes make the glue brittle
- Gap filling glue can sometimes be used instead of putty to fill smaller cracks and joins
- Thin glue typically dries faster than gap filling glue
- Store in cold places (such as refrigerators) when not in use to prolong shelf life
- Use Z-ends to avoid messy over-application of glue.

## Application

- Apply some kind of lotion or glue-gloves to your hand before use
- Apply a small drop or bead of glue to one piece of your model you wish to assemble
- Wait anywhere from 5 to 20 seconds for the glue to begin to “take hold”
- Glue should be completely dry after 5 to 10 minutes of non-movement
- If any gaps are still visible, simply re-apply a dab of glue to fill-in the gap
- Prime can take place anytime after glue has dried and can be painted with no special considerations.

The Sinbad glue is stronger than the traditional Zap-A-Gap glue, but it does come with a higher price tag and is harder to find locally. The stock barrel is too big for miniature use, but I simply attach a z-end directly to it. It makes for a long barrel, but it's worth it and less messy.
